Eating out

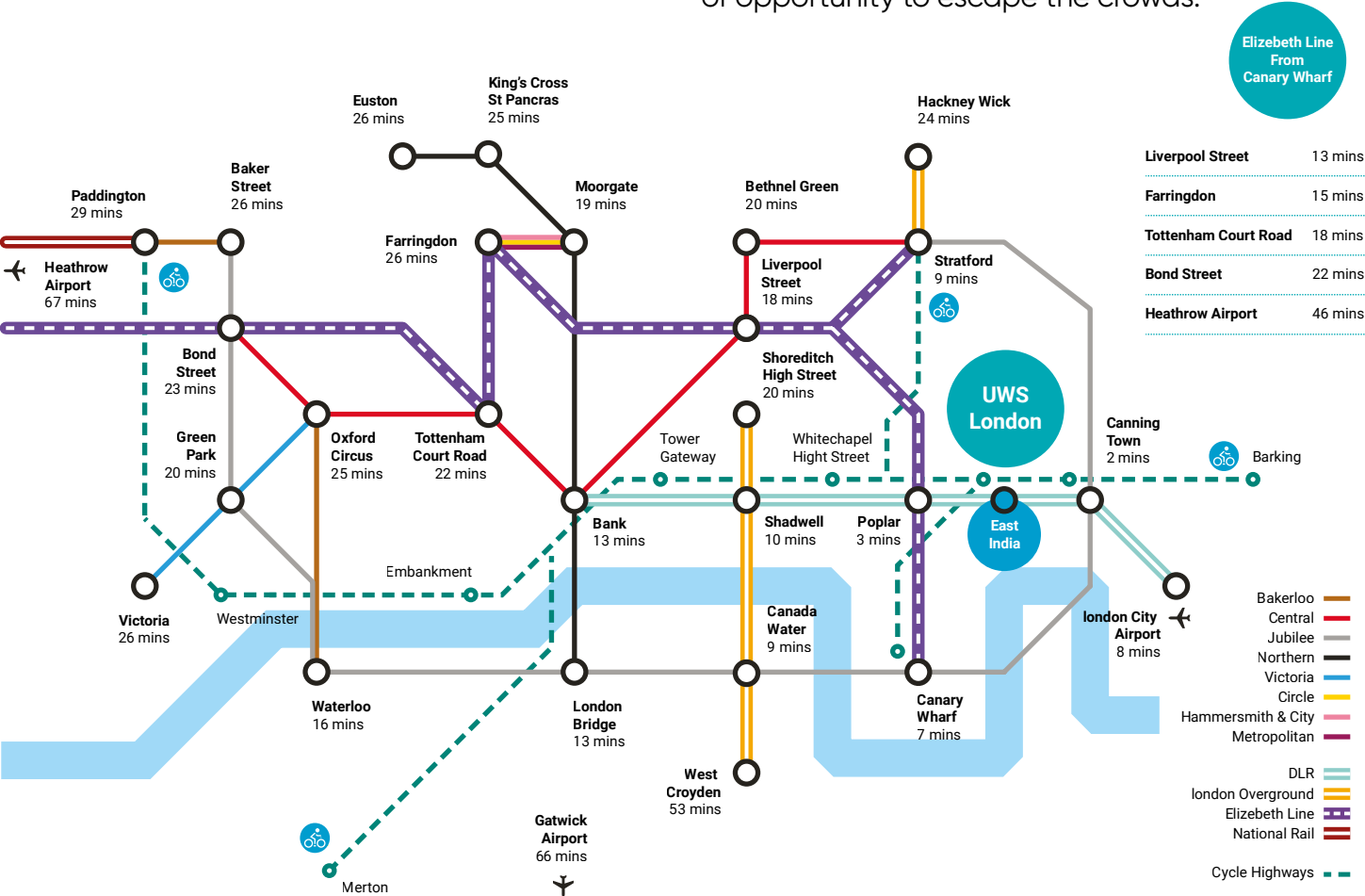

International Foundation Programme (Business)

The International Foundation Programme (Business) offered at UWS London Campus will equip students with the core knowledge, skills and qualifications required to support undergraduate degree study. Successful completion enables students, for example, to enter into the University's BA Hons International Business (see page 26 for details) and complete their degree studies over 2 years 8 months.

The International Foundation programme is designed around three distinct areas:

Core business subjects, English language modules and study skills modules have been developed to deliver up-to-date practical and professional skills, underpinned by appropriate academic theory, to produce students who are ready to undertake undergraduate studies.

This programme aims to be the starting point in a student's journey to becoming a true, 21st century graduate.

About the course

You will be taught by lecturers, senior lecturers and other associated staff, some of whom are regarded as international and world-leading experts in their fields, undertaking important research in their areas of expertise.

Teaching & Assessment

Assessment is carried out through a combination of written exams, presentations, case studies, portfolio building and assignments over each academic level of the degree programme.

What qualifications do you need?

We welcome UK and EU students and consider all applicants on an individual basis.

- Age 17+
- Applicants may also be considered with other academic, vocational or professional qualifications deemed to be equivalent

English language requirements

For applicants whose first language is not English, the University sets a minimum English language proficiency level. The qualifications below must have been gained within two years of the start of your course.

General English language requirements at UWS: International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic module (not General Training)

- Overall score 6.0
- No sub-test less than 5.5
- Applicants with IELTS 4.5 with no component less than 4.0 will be required to undertake a three term programme
- Applicants with IELTS 5.0 with no component less than 4.5 will be required to undertake the two term programme

Duration

The Foundation programme is of 1 year's duration and has intakes in Jan/ May and is offered on a rolling basis. (An additional entry point is offered in July for the 2020 intake only.) Upon successful completion students can enter into the University's BA (Hons) International Business programme and complete Honours degree studies over an additional 2 years 8 months of study.

BA (Hons) International Business

The BA (Hons) International Business at UWS offers an opportunity to study in London towards a business degree that has been developed for the international graduate of today.

The BA (Hons) International Business will help students to develop knowledge and skills that are required of business graduates across the globe.

The degree has been designed to deliver up-to-date practical and professional skills, underpinned by appropriate academic theory which will support the development of 21st century graduates, ready for the workplace.

About the course

Prepare yourself for a career in international business through this specialist degree, giving you the opportunity to study and learn about the vast business landscape, and develop the knowledge and skills to embark upon an exciting profession in any kind of company, from small-to-medium-sized enterprises to large, multinational organisations.

The course challenges students' understanding and judgement of a range of core business practices, including finance, marketing, human resources, general business and economics, and tests your ability to problem-solve in a variety of business situations.

Employability is embedded into the core curriculum, meaning you'll learn vital skills and attributes that are most valued by employers, as well as an in-depth understanding of the business environment and its various, intertwining components.

The course runs over four levels, including teaching activities coupled with independent learning.



The course explores how students can put what they've learned into practice within a business, and how they could implement change in an organisation through the knowledge they've gained.

The course is delivered by UWS lecturers, senior lecturers, and other associated staff with significant industry and academic experience who provide expert advice and insight to prepare you for the business world. Students may also have guest lectures from employers and have the opportunity to visit local and national companies, enabling you to build your knowledge and networks.

Level one introduces students to the basic concepts of business, and the key operational elements of running a company, such as finance, marketing, human resources, general business and economics.

Level 2

In level two the basic concepts are taken to a more operational level and students start to understand the application of each within a business environment.

At level three students will look at the concepts from a more strategic perspective, aligning what has been learned in previous years to specific business scenarios.

Level 4

The final level has a focus on the dissertation, with students looking at their own personal development throughout the duration of the programme.

English language requirements

BSc (Hons) Professional Health Studies

Our course has been developed to enable you to gain the BSc (Hons) Professional Health Studies award by offering generic and practice specific modules that are relevant to modern and often complex health and social care.

The course is structured to build on your previous qualifications and experience to enable you to obtain a Bachelors award after 1 year of full-time study or to obtain an Honours award after 2 years of full-time study.

Our course embodies the principles of adult learning and the individual modules reflect current health and social care delivery where the needs of individuals are increasingly being met by a broad range of services working in partnership to deliver safe, effective, value-based care utilising a person-centred approach.

Professional Health Studies will help you develop greater critical awareness of the factors that need to be addressed in the workplace to improve the health of clients/patients/residents. There is a focus on evidence-based practice which encourages you to develop a proactive attitude to addressing health-related issues.

About the course

The development of graduate skills and attributes is an essential feature of our course and as such individual module content will encourage you to explore new ideas and challenge existing views on contemporary health issues affecting everyday practice.

By doing this you will develop high-level attributes and employability skills which are required to shape local healthcare provision.

By the end of the course you will have the ability to identify and propose solutions to problems which capitalise on the potential for enhanced health and wellbeing for patients, clients, residents, and wider groups; through the development of health improvement strategies at individual, organisational and wider societal levels.

The modules in our course are aligned to three themes:

- **Theme 1:** Research Skill Development
- **Theme 2:** Professional Development
- **Theme 3:** Contemporary Healthcare Issues

You will study at least one module from each theme which will allow you to acquire a holistic range of graduate and other transferable skills that are essential to work successfully and professionally within the health and social care sector.

You can also pursue a conversion course such as our MSc Adult/Mental Health Nursing or MSc Social Work to work as an adult/mental health nurse or social worker respectively.

Master of Public Administration (MPA)

Make an impact in your public or third sector career with a Master's qualification in Public Administration. With a rigorous focus on both social sciences and crisis communications, this course will give you the theoretical and practical understanding needed to take your career to the next level.

This high level, specialist qualification will equip modern public managers and policy-makers with the skills required to make a decisive contribution to solving global public policy issues.

The programme combines a rigorous social science focus on governance, public administration, public policy and politics with a strong grounding in public sector management and communication. Our MPA has a strong international focus and is ideal for professionals looking to progress into a global career.

The teaching team have years of practical experience and insight to share, and will help you build links with our industry partners via the Oxfam partnership, as well as other civil service and public sector bodies. You'll also be able to expand your professional CV by undertaking a practice-based project as part of your final dissertation in collaboration with a public or third sector organisation.

Whether you're looking to enter the world of public management or policy making, or uplevel your current work experience by expanding your sector knowledge, this course will help you develop the knowledge, skills and connections you need to take those vital next steps.

You will gain:

- An understanding of public management, leadership and administration within a global and comparative context
- The opportunity to develop expertise in the area of public management, public leadership, public administration, and governance that interests you
- A deep awareness of crisis management within an organisational context
- The chance to enhance your employability with career-relevant content through innovative learning and assessment
- The opportunity to study within a diverse international community of learners

Areas of study

You will complete five core 20-credit areas of study and a further one optional area of study for the Postgraduate Diploma (PgDip). This ensures that all students can pursue their chosen specialisms on solid intellectual and disciplinary foundations. You will then complete your MPA by carrying out an extended research project dissertation.

For the Postgraduate Diploma (PgDip) stage, you will study the following core areas of study:

- Contemporary Social Issues
- Crisis & Communication
- Crisis Leadership & Management
- Applied Research Methods in Social Science
- Policy Analysis & Practice

To complete the PgDip stage, you will select one further 20 credit area of study from a menu of social science options. Successful completion of the PgDip allows you to proceed to the master's area of study:

- MSc Social Sciences Dissertation (60 credits)

The master's dissertation gives you the opportunity to specialise in an area of public policy, leadership, administration and governance that interests you, while under academic supervision. You will also have the opportunity to enhance your CV by undertaking a work-based project as part of your final dissertation with a partner organisation (e.g. NGOs, campaign groups, public agencies, third sector organisations, etc.).

Teaching & assessment

Students are taught and assessed through a combination of lectures, tutorials, exams and essays. You'll complete five taught core areas of study, plus one option, followed by an extended research dissertation, which may be practice-based.

The course is 16% scheduled learning and 84% independent study. Assessment is 100% coursework based.

Master of Public Administration (MPA) (continued)

Career prospects

An MPA provides a cross-section of skills for professionals looking to work in public, third sector, and even private organisations at management or leadership level.

It's a highly versatile qualification that can lead to a range of top-level positions for individuals looking to make a real impact.

MPA graduates may go on to work as Local Government Analysts, Programme Coordinators, Statisticians, Policy Analysts, CSR Managers, HR Managers and many other positions with a connection to public management, governance or policy.

What qualifications do you need?

- You should hold a relevant Honours degree (or equivalent) at second class lower division (2:2) or above. Relevant subjects include: Social Science, Business, Health, Law or Social Work.
- Applications will also be considered from those with a degree in another discipline or other professional training or experience relevant to the programme at the discretion of the Course Leader.

Our alumni have progressed into successful careers at organisations including Agrekko, IBM, CAP-Gemini, Amazon, Atos, Dell and Adobe Systems, as well as many dynamic small and mid-sized businesses.

If you decide to take your studies further, you have the option to progress to a research degree (MPhil/PhD). Additionally, the IT Academy of the School of Computing offers pathways to go on to learn specific technical skills through programmes with Microsoft, Cisco, Oracle, SAP and others.

What qualifications do you need?

You will normally be expected to have at least one of the following:

- A Bachelor's (Hons) degree from a UK University or an equivalent qualification from an overseas institution in a non-IT or computing related subject, or a modest academic background in IT or computing
- A professional qualification recognised as being equivalent to a Bachelors Honours Degree;
- Have gained equivalent experience in business or industry.

Applicants with an Honours BSc or BA degree in the following (or related) disciplines are encouraged to apply: Business, Engineering, Applied Sciences, Pure/Formal Sciences, Social Sciences, Medical & Health Sciences, Life Sciences, Sports Science, Humanities.

English language requirements

For applicants whose first language is not English, the University sets a minimum English language proficiency level. The qualifications below must have been gained within two years of the start of your course.

Pre-sessional English

Pre-sessional English is an intensive English language course for students who need to improve their English language and study skills prior to enrolling on their chosen degree programme at UWS.

It is designed to help you achieve the University's English language entry requirement for degree level study (IELTS 6.0 overall, with no component lower than 5.5).

About the course

Pre-sessional courses are held during the summer, and at various times during the academic year. Courses last for ten weeks, and comprise 21 hours of instruction and four hours of directed independent study per week.

The pre-sessional English course is a UWS School of Education & Social Sciences programme, delivered by qualified and experienced lecturers overseen by the School.



The focus of the courses is to build on your existing English language skills to prepare you for all aspects of academic study, including:

- Participating in seminars and discussion groups
- Delivering effective presentations
- Understanding lectures and note-taking
- Academic reading and writing
- Study and independent learning skills

Pre-sessional English courses will also develop your cultural awareness and introduce you to living in the UK.

Our taught classes are interactive and communicative to build your confidence when using English. Classes are small, usually with no more than 20 students per group. Independent learning is an essential part of university study, and the hours of directed study will help you develop this skill. You will also attend focused one-to-one tutorials to discuss your progress and any additional support you may need.

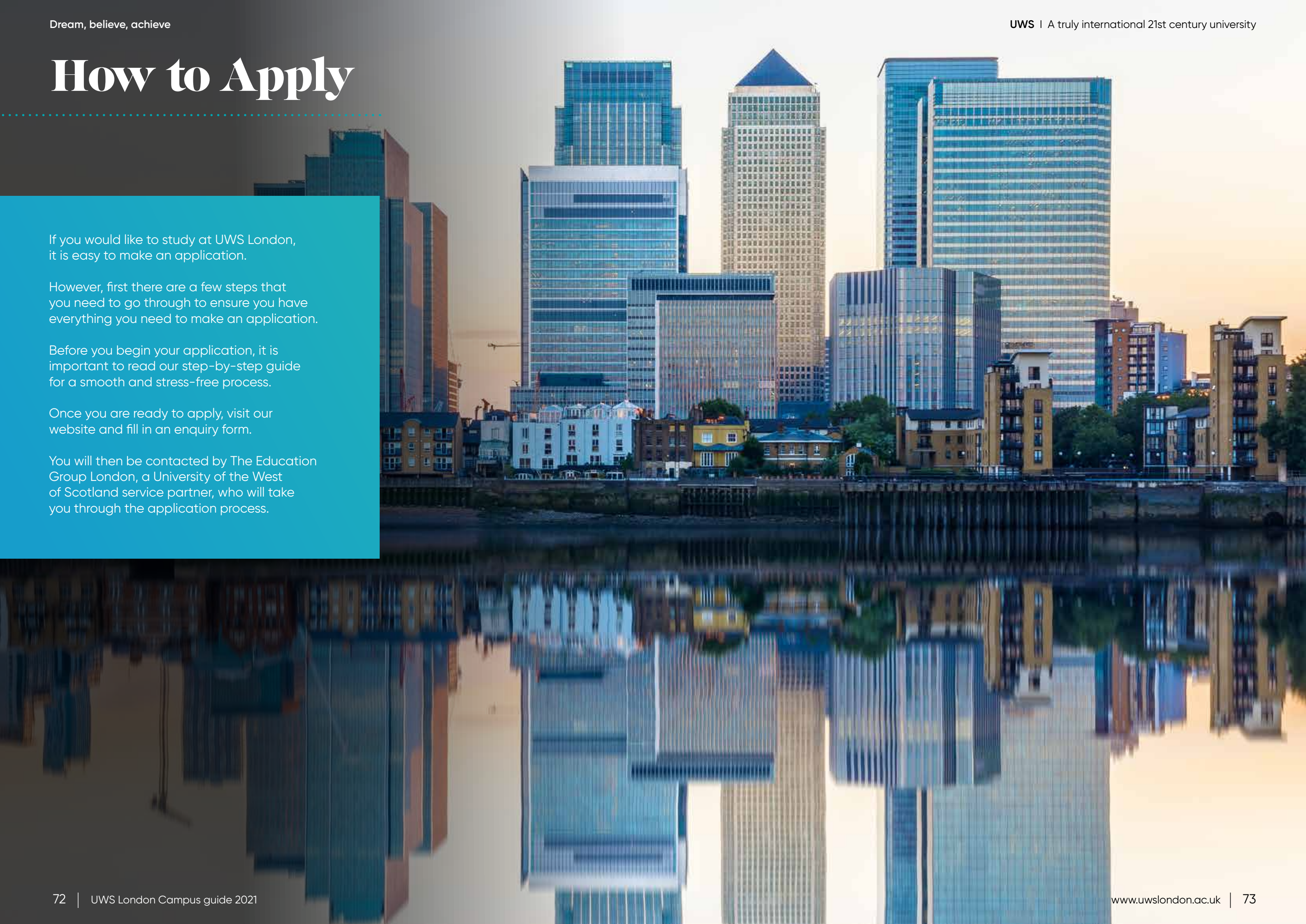

Immigration & visa information for prospective students

If you are planning to study at UWS including nationals of the European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland, then you may need to apply for a visa before travelling to the UK. The type of visa you require depends on the course of study that you have chosen:

- International students undertaking a full-time course that is longer than 6 months generally need a Student visa
- International students undertaking a period of study between 6-11 months can enter as a Short-term student which applies to English Language courses only (from 1 December 2020) International students studying up to 6 months can apply for a Visitor visa (from 1 December 2020).

Paying your fees — International (non-EU) Students

Self-financing international (non-EU) students are required to pay a deposit of £5,000 to secure their CAS (confirmation of acceptance for studies). This Certificate is required to complete your visa application once you have an unconditional offer of a place on a course.

You will generally pay this deposit between 3 months and 6 weeks before the start of your course so that your visa can be processed. If you pay the remaining balance of your tuition fees at least 7 days prior to the start of term, you will be eligible for a 10% early payment fee discount on the balance.

Alternatively, you can make payments in instalments for the remaining fee balance:

1. September intake:

1st instalment: September, prior to enrolment

2nd instalment: 1st November

3rd instalment: 1st February

3. May intake:

1st instalment: May, prior to enrolment

2nd instalment: 1st August

3rd instalment: 1st November

2. January intake:

1st instalment: January, prior to enrolment

2nd instalment: 1st April

3rd instalment: 1st July
